







It brings together a community of readers including librarians, booksellers, publishers, teachers and readers of all ages to support the ability to access books without censorship.



This October, celebrate the books that have come under fire, some hundreds of times (think Harry Potter!). Read 5 challenged and/or banned books from October 1-November 1 and win a prize. Everyone who completes the challenge will enter a drawing for a grand prize.

The American Library Association Office for Intellectual Freedom tracked challenges to over 1,000 unique book titles in 2022 alone. These books are targeted for controversial (or misinterpreted) content for removal from public, school, and university libraries for a variety of reasons-from violent depictions to "teaching children disobedience."
